The recent leaks of NEET UG papers, delays in the NEET PG course, exploitation by private medical colleges, poorly paid stipend, hectic duty hours, non availability of basic facilities at workplace and violence against healthcare professionals are alarming concerns.



The situation is further exacerbated by the rising number of medical student suicides, with over 150 cases reported in the last six years. A survey by the National Medical Commission (NMC) reveals that thousands of students are struggling with mental health issues. These problems extend beyond the medical fraternity, posing a significant challenge to society as a whole. It is essential that we address these issues collectively.

The healthcare and medical education system in our country is indeed in need of improvement. While it's heartening to see the number of seats in government and medical colleges increasing, we must ensure that quality and checks are in place to prevent exploitation ¹.

INITIATIVES TAKEN

The United Doctors Front (UDF) stands as a unified voice advocating for the rights, welfare, and dignity of medical professionals across India. With unwavering commitment, we have undertaken several impactful initiatives to address systemic challenges, ensure justice, and foster an environment of safety and accountability in healthcare.

1. Objection on findings of National Task Force



The United Doctors Front (UDF) had raised objections to the findings of the National Task Force (NTF) on medical professionals' safety, arguing that the recommendations are insufficient. UDF had urged the Supreme Court to establish a Central Protection Act for doctors, emphasizing the need for a robust legal framework to prevent violence and ensure safer working conditions.

2. Intervention in Raipur Ragging





The United Doctors Front (UDF) had expressed deep concern over the alleged night-long ragging incident at AIIMS Raipur, calling the hospital management's outright denial unacceptable. They stressed the need for strict anti-ragging measures, confidential reporting systems, and proper investigations to ensure a safe and supportive environment for all medical students.

The United Doctors Front (UDF) had urged Union Health Minister Jagat Prakash Nadda to establish protocols for VIP visits during hospital emergencies. Citing disruptions to patient care and medical services, UDF recommended scheduling visits after initial emergency responses, limiting them to 30 minutes, and minimizing entourages. They stressed the need for unobstructed emergency routes and efficient coordination to ensure patient care remains a top priority.

4. Objection on visit of MP Rajeev Rai in Mau Dist Hospital in UP

United Doctors Front (UDF) had strongly condemned the alleged misconduct by Samajwadi Party MP Rajeev Rai during his visit to Mau District Hospital, which disrupted operations and compromised patient care. UDF called for strict protocols to govern political visits to healthcare facilities, ensuring no interference with medical duties, and stands in solidarity with healthcare professionals, urging immediate action to uphold hospital integrity.

5. Objection on notice by MLA in Kashmir




Dr. Lakshay Mittal wrote to the Lieutenant Governor of Jammu and Kashmir, raising concerns over the suspension of PHC inspections and the withholding of salaries for medical officers. He urged immediate action to restore inspections, ensure timely salary payments, and prevent future disruptions, stressing the importance of supporting healthcare professionals and maintaining healthcare standards.

6. Protest of violence on health care professionals




United Doctors Front (UDF) responded swiftly to increasing violence against healthcare professionals, citing an attack on a resident doctor in Rajasthan during Duty Roster Posting (DRP). In response to such violence, UDF took immediate measures at the ground level to ensure the safety of healthcare workers. They organized protests, raised awareness, and engaged with local authorities to demand stricter security protocols in hospitals and healthcare facilities. UDF called for robust action against perpetrators of violence and for stronger legal protections for medical professionals to safeguard their dignity and well-being.

7. Chitradurga District Hospital, Karnataka



In response to harassment claims by DNB residents at Chitradurga District Hospital, Karnataka, the United Doctors Front (UDF) filed a complaint with the National Human Rights Commission (NHRC). The residents reported overwork, threats of stipend withholding, and being coerced into roles outside their curriculum. The NHRC directed the District Magistrate to take action within eight weeks. UDF also filed RTI applications to the National Medical Commission and Karnataka Government for transparency on staffing and treatment of medical trainees, highlighting their commitment to protecting healthcare professionals' rights.

8. The delay in NEET PG 2024, a mounting pressure on doctors and aspirants.



The NEET PG 2024 examination sparked widespread frustration due to repeated delays, inconsistent decisions, and a lack of transparency from the National Board of Examinations (NBE). Aspirants and petitioners emphasized the need for transparency and a Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) to prevent recurring issues. Concerns over discrepancies in scores, wasted time, and uncertain futures have left students questioning whether their dedication is truly valued. The United Doctors Front (UDF) has actively represented medical students, raised questions about the delays, issued public statements, and supported student protests to advocate for timely exam conduct. The controversy highlights the urgent need for structural reforms to restore faith in the examination process and ensure transparency, accountability, and respect for healthcare professionals.

9. The leak of NEET UG 2024, an inadequacy of the medical education system.



"India's medical education has been destroyed. This abrupt change, following the NEET-UG scom, underscores a deeply troubling pattern in handling medical examinations and the overall medical education system in India," he said, adding that the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) should intervene and take strict action on the exam-conducting bodies.



The NEET-UG 2024, a key exam for medical aspirants, faced controversies over question paper leaks, integrity breaches, and 'grace marks,' leading to legal battles in the Supreme Court. The CBI had traced the leak using a partially burned question paper.

Chief Justice DY Chandrachud had noted that rescheduling would have affected over 24 lakh students. In response, the government had enacted the Public Examinations (Prevention of Unfair Means) Act, 2024, enforcing strict penalties for malpractice. UDF had advocated for transparent investigations, accountability, and improved exam security to restore trust in the system.

10. The policy of service and education bonds for upcoming doctors should be abolished.



MBBS graduates must fulfill service obligations as per State Government policies set by the Health and Education Department. NEET UG counseling students should be informed about bond terms and amounts before admission.

Key Bond Policies being

- (1) Fixed Deposit Bond: A set amount is frozen as a bank guarantee, forfeited if service obligations aren't met post-MBBS.
- (2) Compulsory Rural Service Bond: Some states mandate service in Primary Health Centers (PHCs), especially for students receiving scholarships or fee reimbursements.

UDF played a crucial role in raising awareness about bond policies among aspiring medical students, ensuring transparency during NEET UG counseling, and advocating for a standardized national policy for service obligations.]

11. An outrage over THE RAJASTHAN HONOUR OF DEAD BODY BILL, 2023





The Rajasthan Honour of Dead Body Act, 2023, criminalizes the use of dead bodies in protests, protecting the dignity of the deceased and data related to unclaimed bodies. UDF in Rajasthan played a key role in the Act's implementation by initiating and supporting the legislation. As the ruling party, they contributed to discussions, amendments, and negotiations, ensuring the Act aligned with their vision while addressing concerns related to public order and dignity. UDF also played a role in garnering public support for the legislation. This involved communicating the need for the Act, addressing potential concerns, and building consensus among the public and relevant stakeholders.

12. A strong stance against unqualified medical practitioners (Quacks/Jholachaaps)



Fake practitioners in various medical fields are endangering patient safety, with 1,436 fake doctors' clinics sealed since 2007. Recently, The Gujarat Police apprehended 14 fake doctors who bought medical degrees from the gang for just Rs. 70000. Additionally, there is a database of 1200 fake degrees.

A Portal to complain about bogus doctors is the need of the hour.

There is a lack of awareness among police on how to deal with such cases. The portal could serve as a first step in taking action against bogus practitioners. Enforcement of the KPME Act is difficult due to local support and lack of evidence, and the UDF has supported stronger regulations. A new portal allows the public to report fake doctors, and the UDF has backed efforts to raise awareness and push for clearer legal guidelines, while the GPA seeks clearer prosecution steps in the High Court.



13. UDF's Strategic Use of RTI to Address Healthcare Disparities



The United Doctors Front (UDF) is actively addressing healthcare issues through RTI filings and advocacy. In Karnataka, UDF demanded transparency in staffing and treatment of DNB and Diploma resident doctors at Chitradurga District Hospital, calling for action against alleged lapses. In Delhi, UDF exposed unethical aesthetic practices, highlighting that dentists aren't qualified for procedures like Botox. In Rajasthan, an RTI revealed stipend discrepancies in private medical colleges, with UDF urging fair compensation for medical interns and residents. These efforts reflect UDF's commitment to transparency, ethical practices, and justice in healthcare.

14. UDF Commends NMC's Action on Stipend Discrepancies



The NMC issued show-cause notices to several medical colleges for failing to submit stipend payment details for interns, postgraduate, and senior residents, following UDF's concerns about irregularities, especially in private institutions. Acting on a Supreme Court directive, the NMC emphasized potential penalties for non-compliance. UDF commended this step and urged surprise inspections to address exploitation and non-payment issues. An RTI revealed significant stipend discrepancies, highlighting the need for standardized and fair compensation to safeguard interns' and residents' rights and ensure smooth healthcare operations.

Medical education in India faces significant challenges, including rising malpractices in NEET exams, persistent ragging, and alarming mental health concerns, with over 150 student suicides in six years. Delayed stipends, exorbitant fees, inadequate facilities in private colleges, and violence against junior doctors further exacerbate these issues. With medical studies spanning nearly 10 years, these hardships deeply affect both students and their parents. To address these concerns, the United Doctors Front (UDF) launched the "Parents of Doctors" initiative, creating a platform for parents to collaborate on solutions and advocate for the well-being of medical students.

16. Preparation of 'National Register of Harm' to keep record of incidents against medicos

Imagine a comprehensive record of every incident of violence against healthcare workers in India. This is the vision behind the "National Register of Harm," a crucial initiative that UDFA are actively championing. By meticulously documenting each attack, this register would equip UDF with powerful data to fuel their advocacy efforts. This data would not only vividly illustrate the scale of the problem but also help pinpoint patterns and trends, allowing for more targeted interventions and a stronger push for policy change that prioritize the safety and well-being of the healthcare society.

17. Expanding the Scope of UDF: A Multi-Stakeholder Approach


UDF is expanding its efforts by involving journalists, RTI activists, and non-medicos to amplify policy advocacy and raise awareness about healthcare challenges. These include inadequate infrastructure, workforce shortages, inequitable access, corruption, and poor regulation in medical education. This collaboration aims to strengthen transparency, accountability, and evidence-based reporting while fostering a united approach to address key healthcare issues.

18. UDF Advocates for Healthcare Reforms in Landmark Suo Motu Case

The Rajasthan High Court, Jaipur Bench, led by Justice Anoop Kumar Dhand, took "suo motu cognizance" of the worsening healthcare system in Rajasthan, stressing that the "Right to Health" is an essential part of the "Right to Life" under Article 21 of the Constitution. The court cited alarming reports from 'Rajasthan Patrika' about untrained staff handling dialysis under unhygienic conditions and the lack of basic facilities like emergency beds and trolleys. Notices were issued to the Union of India and the State of Rajasthan, seeking explanations and action plans to address these issues.


The "United Doctors Front (UDF)" filed an "intervention petition", raising important concerns and advocating for reforms. Although the case was later withdrawn for technical reasons, UDF's involvement demonstrated its growing influence and commitment to driving crucial changes in India's healthcare system. The court's initiative and UDF's participation underscored the urgent need for better healthcare infrastructure and accountability. While the case titled "Suo Motu: In the Matter of Right to Health and Well Being of Everyone" did not move forward, UDF's role in the matter highlighted its dedication to ensuring quality healthcare and influencing policy reforms at the national level.

19. Supreme Court Acknowledges UDF's Concerns



The Supreme Court of India, in a landmark judgment, directed the Union Health Ministry and state authorities to implement safety protocols in medical facilities, including CCTV cameras and distress systems, to protect healthcare professionals. It assured no action against doctors who protested for their safety and included UDF in the National Task Force for direct representation in policy discussions. With strict timelines set for implementation, UDF suspended its nationwide strike while continuing to advocate for a Central Protection Act to ensure long-term legal safeguards for medical practitioners.

20. Representation in National Medical Commission (NMC)





The UDF actively participates in discussions and policy-making processes within the National Medical Commission (NMC) to ensure that the voices of medical professionals are heard. They advocate for fair regulations on working hours, postgraduate training, and professional standards in medical education and practice. UDF pushes for transparency in the implementation of NMC guidelines and ensures that doctors' grievances, including salary delays and workplace harassment, are addressed. They have also been vocal about revisions in the NEXT and its impact on medical students.

21. Representation in National Human Rights Commission (NHRC)





UDF approaches the NHRC for violations of healthcare workers' human rights, including instances of workplace violence, denial of leave, and inadequate mental health support. They have filed complaints and petitions to NHRC regarding violence against doctors and harassment faced by medical professionals at the hands of authorities or patients' families. UDF also advocates for timely legal action against perpetrators of violence against healthcare workers and the proper implementation of laws like the Healthcare Workers Protection Act.

22. Engagement with State and Central Authorities on Various Issues



UDF has consistently written letters and petitions to both state and central governments regarding pressing healthcare concerns. Key areas include:

- Occupational Safety: Ensuring proper security measures in hospitals to prevent violence against doctors.
- Mental Health Awareness: Proposing mental health support systems for doctors and medical students.
- Salary and Stipend Delays: Highlighting irregular payment of salaries and stipends for resident doctors.

They have also raised concerns about postgraduate seat allocation processes and called for reforms in medical education policies.

23. Suicide Cases



The tragic suicide of doctors sheds light on the immense mental health pressures faced by young medical professionals. UDF issued statements emphasizing the urgent need for institutional mental health support systems in hospitals and medical colleges. UDF called for mandatory counseling services, regular mental health check-ups, and grievance redressal mechanisms for students and resident doctors.

UDF also demanded a thorough investigation into the systemic factors contributing to such tragedies, including academic pressure, workplace harassment, and lack of emotional support.

24. Murder and Rape at RG Kar Medical College; Black Ribbon Protests





The heinous crime at RG Kar Medical College, where a trainee doctor was raped and murdered, triggered widespread outrage in the medical community. UDF played a pivotal role in organizing nationwide protests and strikes, with doctors wearing black ribbons to express solidarity and demand justice. Their demands included:

- Swift legal action against the perpetrators.
- Enhanced safety measures for medical staff, including surveillance and better security infrastructure in hospitals.
- Zero tolerance towards harassment and violence against healthcare workers. These protests highlighted the larger issue of safety in healthcare institutions and sparked national conversations about workplace security.

25. No Tobacco Campaign





UDF has been at the forefront of anti-tobacco campaigns, emphasizing the severe health risks associated with tobacco use. They advocate for:

- Stricter laws on tobacco sale near educational institutions.
- Inclusion of anti-tobacco education in school curriculums.
- Public awareness campaigns focusing on smoking cessation and early detection of tobacco-related diseases.

UDF collaborates to run awareness drives in hospitals and schools.

26. Voicing a demand for timely and democratic elections for the State Medical Councils

Timely and democratically elected State Medical Councils are crucial for ensuring accountability, transparency, and representation in the medical profession. Elected bodies are more responsive to the needs of medical professionals, promote diverse perspectives, and reduce external interference, safeguarding the council's independence.

They play a key role in upholding ethical standards, improving healthcare policies, and regulating medical education to maintain high training standards and ensure patient safety.

The United Doctors Front (UDF) actively advocates for these principles through public advocacy, campaigns, and collaboration with civil society organizations. They issue press statements, run awareness campaigns, and emphasize democratic reforms as a policy priority to ensure fair and timely elections in State Medical Councils, fostering a transparent and accountable healthcare governance system.

27. Encouraging the hiring of medical and nursing staff according to the sanctioned positions

Screening, shortlisting, and conducting interviews or selection tests help assess candidates' suitability, followed by background checks and credential verification. Effective onboarding and orientation programs ensure smooth integration of new hires into the healthcare system.

Key principles such as diversity, inclusion, transparency, fairness, and compliance with employment regulations guide the process.
